

Additionally, it requires investment in innovation and future-oriented sectors to secure Europe's strategic autonomy and create quality jobs, with strengthened social rights, ensuring a just transition.

European security architecture, unwavering support for Ukraine, frozen Russian assets, and the phase-out of Russian gas and other Russian energy commodities in the EU

Europe must be able to defend itself, which requires a strong European Defence Technological and Industrial Base (EDTIB) and common tools. It must also increase and accelerate support for Ukraine. A just and lasting peace for Ukraine and Europe can only be achieved from a position of strength, making solid security guarantees essential. At the same time, the aggressor, Russia, must be held accountable for its war crimes. This means member states should tighten sanctions and seize frozen Russian state assets to support Ukraine.

New common approach on returns
